The maturation. Approximately 11 years are already done, so part of the hold is behind you.

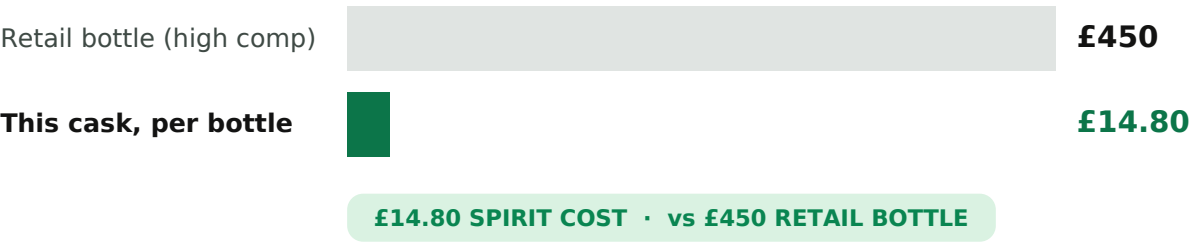
The entry economics. At 386 bottles per cask the spirit cost is £14.80 per 70cl bottle before tax, the level you enter at.

Pricing & Outlook

What you pay against what the bottles sell for, and where the value can go.

This cask comes to the platform at £46 per litre of alcohol, a total of approximately £5,713. That works out to 386 bottles at a spirit cost of £14.80 per 70cl bottle before tax. The bar below sets that figure against comparable Clynelish bottlings selling at retail today, which reach £450 per bottle.



The bottles behind that comparison, live at retail today:

Comparables run from £105 to £450 per bottle. That spread is the room a cask has to grow into over a longer hold.

05 / THE DISTILLERY

The Distillery

The waxy Highland malt at the heart of Johnnie Walker.

Clynelish sits on the Northern Highland coast at Brora in Sutherland, on a site first established in 1819 by the Marquess of Stafford. The distillery you see today was built next door in 1967 to meet blending demand, while the original buildings were renamed Brora and went on to become one of the most legendary closed distilleries in Scotch before reopening in 2021. Clynelish is famous for a thick, waxy, honeyed texture that comes from a deliberately preserved character in its production, a mouthfeel that almost no other distillery manages to replicate.

Around 95% of Clynelish production is taken by Diageo for blending, where it is a core single malt in both Johnnie Walker Gold Label Reserve and the prestigious Blue Label, which selects only around one cask in every ten thousand. That allocation pattern is exactly why a single cask of Clynelish reaching private hands is so unusual, and why independent bottlings command strong prices when they appear.

The cask offered here is a ex-bourbon fill, approximately 11 years matured, held in HMRC-bonded storage at Alloa in Scotland. It comes to the platform at £46 per litre of alcohol, roughly £5,713 per cask, a spirit cost of £14.80 per 70cl bottle before tax.

A permanent institutional buyer

With the vast majority of output committed to Johnnie Walker, Clynelish has a built-in demand floor. Diageo will keep absorbing production for as long as those blends are on shelves, which underpins the value of the small amount that escapes to the open market.

Genuine single-cask scarcity

Because so little Clynelish is available to independent buyers, bottlers actively compete for the parcels that do surface. Single-cask Clynelish from names like Signatory and Berry Bros routinely sells at retail prices that imply cask values well above standard Highland stock.

A distinctive, recognisable style

The waxy, fruity Clynelish profile is prized by collectors and easy to talk about. A buyer does not need a whisky education to understand why the malt inside Johnnie Walker Blue is worth holding.
